Sir Rory was one of the greatest of the MacLeod chiefs, and his court at Dunvegan was a vigorous centre for the traditional performing arts: "a mansion blithe and festive, thronged with young men and with maidens, where the clangour of the drinking-horns was loud...The chessmen would rattle and the harp would be sounding...Thereafter would be chronicled the epic...of the Fiann..."
